



## Remote Education 2020/21 Overview for Parents

### Introduction

In September 2020, we returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class or the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time.

This meets the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support.'

### Overview

Following consultation with parents and reviewing the work that engaged the children during the summer lockdown, we have put in place a plan for remote learning. This will enable all children (who are fit and healthy) to continue with their education should a period of isolation be necessary. This can be read alongside our Remote Education Policy.

A typical day for this age involves a lot of play – often child initiated. Whole class learning time is always kept short and snappy and individual learning jobs are not lengthy either. Typical attention span is 3 – 5 minutes per year of a child's age so, aged 5 years, we would expect children to concentrate for between 15 and 25 minutes. We have taken this into account when considering what remote learning will look like for our pupils.

### Whole class/school remote learning

1. Weekly REFLECT sheets (similar to the homework REFLECT sheets) will be shared, providing learning across the curriculum.
2. You will receive at least 2 pre-recorded videos a day (phonics and maths focus).
3. Twice a week (on a Monday and Friday), we will meet all the children in a zoom session so they see their teachers and their friends.
4. We will also provide a list of further recommended resources.

### Weekly overview

In addition to the weekly REFLECT sheet, each week will follow this pattern:

Monday: pre-recorded phonics and maths videos, story of the week, live zoom session

Tuesday: pre-recorded phonics and maths videos, art activity

Wednesday: pre-recorded phonics and maths videos, PE lesson

Thursday: pre-recorded phonics and maths videos, singing & signing

Friday: pre-recorded phonics and maths videos, live zoom session

We will avoid any activities that need printing but please remember that you have the phonics and maths packs sent in the Autumn term.

*If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (eg, laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.*

### Platform

The school will use Class Dojo for the above remote learning where each class will have their own page. This, as usual, will also be our main platform for sharing information.

## Pre-recorded Lessons

The pre-recorded phonics and maths lessons will follow a similar structure that we use to deliver lessons in school. Each lesson starts with a recap activity that is designed to activate prior learning and give an opportunity to practice key skills. The next part of the lesson introduces and explains new content, moving on to guided practice. Finally children are encouraged to practice what they have learnt independently and then review and reflect on their learning. Lessons may be offered to the whole class or to smaller groups.

In addition, there will be further pre-recorded activities – for example, stories, art activities and singing/signing activities.

## **uyewThe Oak National Academy**

The 'teaching content may also be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom 'each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home.

### **Providing feedback**

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via Seesaw or Dojo. Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

### **Contact with pupils/ parents**

Parents are able to contact teachers via Class Dojo or Mrs Hart via email. Feedback will be provided if required. We will aim to respond within 48 hours.

Where a pupil is self-isolating on medical grounds for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed. Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by a member of our pastoral team on a weekly basis and support offered as necessary.

### **Safeguarding**

### **Data protection and sharing personal data**

When accessing personal data, all staff members will only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop only. Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

### **Keeping devices secure**

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time. Operating systems must be up to date – always install the latest updates.

### **Monitoring arrangements**

Our approach to remote education will be reviewed by the Principal as and when updates to home learning are provided by the government.
